College Profile

Sarupathar College is the premier institute of higher education in the greater Dhansiri Sub-Division of Golaghat district along the Assam-Nagaland border which covers an area of 888 sq. km. Embellished by its diverse ethnic groups with their rich cultural heritage, this region can aptly be called Assam in miniature. The river Dhansiri flows 2 km. west from the college and the river Doyang flows 6 km. east from the college. The college is situated at a distance of 55 km. to the south of the district headquarters at Golaghat, bounded by unbroken chain of the Naga Hills to the south-east and south and the Karbi Hills to the west. Located at Naharani at the outskirts of the town this college is at a distance of about 3 km. from Sarupathar Railway Station (NF Railway).

Established on November 14th in the year 1970 with Mr. Muhi Kanta Tamuly as its Principal, Sarupathar College is the outcome of the toil and hardship of a host of leading personalities of the greater Sarupathar area, who had been longing to see the light of higher education in this outlying remote part of the country. The dream was realized with conviction when the college was brought under deficit grants by the Assam government in 1981. Thus, a new era dawned on this premier educational institution not without tremendous perils and sacrifice faced by some of the founder teachers and well-wishers. Today the college owes much to the local community who had contributed so much to see the college where it stands today. At the same time the college stands faithful to its commitment by giving her very best in the field of higher education. On the other hand, the introduction of the Commerce Stream in the year 1985 was another feather to the cap. The college got permanent affiliation under Dibrugarh University up to degree level in 1994-1995 and was declared, along with the other colleges of Assam, a provincialized college in December, 2005. Though it is a degree college, the institution has also been providing facilities for studies in higher secondary courses in both Arts and Commerce stream.

This institution is venturing into new frontiers in a quest for quality enhancement accommodating co-curricular activities, besides its general curriculum. Now the college has successfully completed 52 years of its existence and is able to meet the needs and aspirations of the people of the Dhansiri Sub-Division in particular and other areas in general. The college bears the responsibility of uplifting the socio-economic development of the backward, rural and inter- state bordering region. It is our humble anticipation that the college will open up new vistas of learning for the students by providing ample opportunities in all possible fields for unravelling the hidden talents of the students.

UG Programmes with the Provision of Multiple Entry/Exit

(i) UG Certificate programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 44 Credits on completion of Semester II if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

(ii) UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 88 Credits on completion of Semester IV if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill base vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.

(iii) Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA & B. Com disciplines): Students who wish to undergo 3 years UG programme with major shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 132 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

(iv) Four Year UG Programme with Honours (BA and B. Com disciplines): Students who wish students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme with major shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

(v) Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA and B. Com disciplines): Students with single/double major who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.

Attendance

- The Course Teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.
- All Course Teachers of college/institutions shall intimate the Principal through the Head of the Department concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days.
- A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. However, it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Principals of the College on payment of a prescribed fee(s). The Principals of the Colleges shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to take the End- semester examinations in the various Programmes and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates shall have to repeat the concerned Course(s) when it is offered next.
- A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/she shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

Credit System

A 'credit' is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15 weeks). A course may have only a lecture component/a lecture and tutorial component/a lecture and practicum component/a lecture, tutorial and practicum component/only practicum component.

Grading System

The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

Semester Duration

- Odd Semesters: July–December (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
- Even Semester: January-June (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
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Academic Bank of Credit (ABC)

- Institution shall make ABC ID a mandatory field in the admission forms, Examination forms or if possible, on students Identity card also.
- Institution shall display the posters and templates and place them on the canteen, Library, Notice Board and around the playground or the place where there is maximum movements of students.
- Students shall register themselves by visiting the ABC website and creating a student account through the concerned institution and records has to be submitted to the institution.
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Examination and Evaluation

- Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.
- There shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

Credit Transfer

Inter-Institutional transfer of Credits may be considered by the Dibrugarh University on reciprocal basis or in compliance with the relevant Guidelines of the UGC. However, a candidate from other university has to fulfill minimum credit requirements as prescribed by Dibrugarh University.

Mentor Mentee Forum

There shall be Mentor Mentee forums in each semester in each of the Department. The forum will comprise of the Mentor to be appointed by the Head of the department and assigned mentees. Concerned mentor shall act as Chairperson and a nominated/selected mentee as Coordinator.

Code of Conduct (General)

All the members of college fraternity should work within the institutional policies and practices so as to satisfy the vision and mission of the college. All members are responsible for protecting and taking

reasonable steps to prevent the theft or misuse of, or damage to college assets including all kinds of physical assets, movable and immovable property. They should follow the rules and regulations of the College as prevalent from time to time. They shall devote their time and their best efforts for the progress of the College. Every member must be punctual, sincere and regular in their approach. They must attend all functions of the college as per the instructions of the college administration. There should be no discrimination-based gender/sexuality/age/marital status, disability or impairment (physical disability or medical status). The members should work in cooperation and collaborative manner with others through academic and administrative activities to achieve the goals. Every member should maintain the confidentiality regarding the College's affairs and the affairs of its constituents and should not divulge, directly or indirectly, any information of confidential nature either to a member of the public or of the College's staff, unless compelled to do so by a judicial or other authority or unless instructed to do so by a superior officer in the discharge of his/her duties.

Every member of the college fraternity will have to maintain the green and ravishing campus of the college. He/she must contribute towards the Green Practices and efforts taken by the college He/she must preserve the rich bio-diversity of the college and will have to maintain the clean and plastic-free environment of the College. Every member should co-operate in the initiatives taken by the college authority to reduce the energy intensity in the college campus.

Code of Conduct for Students

- All the students of the college are required to maintain a high standard of discipline and obey the rules and regulation of the college.
- The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and other members of the staff in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc., are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action like imposition of fine, non-award of college certificate, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
- All forms of ragging in the college campus are prohibited. Strong disciplinary action, as the college authorities deem fit, (following the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India) may be taken if anyone is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.
- UNIFORM: The following garments are prescribed as the College Uniform for the students (i) White shirt and black full pant for boys; and (ii) blue Kurta, white Pyzama and white Dupatta or white Chadar Mekhela with blue border and Blue blouse for girls. Every instance of violating the uniform will be penalized with a fine of Rs. 100/-
- The courses offered by Sarupathar College are full time courses. No student can take any other full-time course simultaneously.
- Student societies and associations may be formed subject to rules and regulations prescribed by the college administration from time to time.
- Only such societies and associations recognized by the Head of Institution can avail the facilities within college premises.
- Smoking, chewing and spitting tobacco products or pan masala, consumption of alcohol or narcotic drugs is strictly prohibited inside the college premises. Violation of this rule will invite disciplinary action. The college premises is a smoking free zone, respect it.
- Students are not allowed to loiter or stand about the verandas or corridors of the college during class hours.

- Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the college premises needs approval of the college authority.
- All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the Institution and his decisions are final in all matters.
- Students will have to attend Morning Assembly at 10 AM positively.
- Use of mobile phones inside college campus is strictly prohibited. In case of detection of violating the rule, his or her guardian will be called for and will be penalized with a fine of Rs 1000/-

Facilities

Library

- The College has a rich Library with a collection of exceeding 27,000 number of books apart from several journals and reference books. It has an enriched subscription of journals, newspapers and magazines catering to the needs of faculty and students. The library has a well-furnished reading room accommodating a large number of faculty and students. The students must abide by the rules of the library.
- Students must take Library Card for borrowing books. Two books can be borrowed at a time for a period not exceeding 15 (fifteen) days. Books issued can be recalled at any time in case of urgency by the Librarian.
- Library Card are not transferable.
- A fine of twenty-five (25) paise per book per day will be charged, if the borrowers fail to return the books on due date.
- Requisition slip must be submitted before one day of issuing the books from the library.
- Reference books, newspaper, periodicals and question papers are not allowed to be taken out of the library. Question papers are available for copying only.
- Silence should be maintained in the library. The Reading Room remains open during the college routine hours.
- Students must return the library books before filling up the Examination Form. No students will be allowed to fill up the Examination Form without Library Clearance Certificate.
- The Librarian shall bring it to the notice of the Principal, if any student is found to have damaged or misused books, made noise or misbehaved in any other way will make the student liable to disciplinary action.
- Books will have to be replaced from any source if lost, torn or mutilated in any other way.
- The students may bring to the notice to the Librarian their grievances if any.
- The College Library remains open on all working days of the College from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- The days for borrowing of library books may be fixed by the librarian as per convenience.

IQAC

The college has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) which monitors various academic, non-academic and co-curricular activities of the college. The cell keeps correspondence with the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and submits Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) to the NAAC. The cell conducts annual departmental inspection of all the teaching departments and prepares academic report which is submitted to the principal. It also monitors the activities of different cells, committees, clubs, student achievements and other quality enhancement activities.

Departmental Library

The members of the teaching staff have at their own initiative launched a modest effort towards establishing eight departmental libraries for the benefit of the students of each department. Emphasis is laid on improving the departmental Libraries with more collection of reference books.

Financial Assistance for Poor and Meritorious Students

A Student Aid-Fund was established in 2002 in order to provide some financial assistance to meritorious students coming from economically weaker sections of the society. To raise this fund an annual collection of Rs. 20/- from each student is made. The Aid-Fund Committee, after taking into consideration all aspects of the applications, decides the amount of aid to be given to a particular student. Aid will be given to students who are not only poor but also meritorious, regular in attendance and have good performance in extra-curricular activities.

- **Dr. Bhabendranath Saikia Memorial Award:** The award comprises Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand) only along with Certificate of Merit and is conferred by Department of Sociology. This award is given away to the student of the college obtaining highest marks (minimum 75% marks) in Sociology Honours in Degree Final Semester Examination of Dibrugarh University. The award has been conferred since 2017 and is sponsored by Ms. Moni Prova Bora, formerly Principal i/c, Head, Department of Sociology.
- **Late Jibeswar Phukan Memorial Award:** This award is sponsored by Dr. Pranab Phukan, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Assamese in loving memory of his father Late Jibeswar Phukan. The award will be conferred to the student, preferably hailing from financially weaker section, securing highest marks in Degree (Arts/Commerce) Final Semester Examination of Dibrugarh University from the session 2021-22.
- **Late Indreswar Chakrabarty Memorial Best Graduate Award:** The award comprises Rs. 5,000/- (Rupees five thousand) only along with Certificate of Merit and is conferred to the student of Arts Stream of the college obtaining highest marks in BA Final Examination of Dibrugarh University. The award has been conferred since 2023 and is sponsored by Dr. Prapti Thakur, Principal, Sarupathar College.
- **Best Commerce Graduate Award:** The award comprises Rs. 5,000/- (Rupees five thousand) only along with Certificate of Merit and is conferred to the student of Commerce Stream of the college obtaining highest marks in B.Com. Final Examination of Dibrugarh University. The award has been conferred since 2023 and is sponsored by faculty members, Department of Commerce, Sarupathar College.
- **Best Readers Awards:** Under this, three awards will be provided (first, second and third best reader) to the students of B.A. / B.Com. programmes by Central Library of Sarupathar College. The awards comprise a certificate of appreciation, a medal and a bundle of books.

- **Most Engaging Student Award:** This award will be conferred to the three students of B.A. and B.Com. programmes on the basis of their engagement in various scholastic and co-scholastic activities of the college. This award comprises of a certificate of appreciation, a medal and a bundle of books.
- **Department Best Graduate Award:** This award will be provided by each individual department to the students obtaining highest marks in degree final examination. The award includes a certificate of appreciation, a medal and a bundle of books.

Special Class / Tutorials

The faculty members of the college take special class/tutorials for the benefit of the students. Students who face problems in understanding certain concepts in classrooms can discuss their problems with the teachers in a friendly atmosphere. Generally, the faculty members divide the students into small groups and impart teaching to the students.

Students' Union
